

Grade Two News-February 2019



February will be another busy month in grade two. On February 6th grade twos will participate in their last skating class at the arena. We hope to skate at Centennial Park on February 13 if the weather allows. Please send your child's skates and helmet (in a sturdy bag that is easy to carry) as well as mittens and snow pants. Students are not allowed on the ice without a <u>CSA approved skating/hockey helmet.</u> Bike helmets, skiing helmets, etc are not permitted. For the students who do not have skates we will try to find a pair in our school collection. We will also have a few extra helmets for students. We appreciate volunteers to assist with the tying of skates. If your family or someone you know has skates or helmets at home that no longer fit or are needed, our school would happily accept them as donations!

On **Thursday February 14** we will be inviting a few **students from each afternoon class to donate items for our Valentine's Day lunch.** A note will be sent home in February. A class list, with students first names, is located on the last page of the newsletter. Students are not required to exchange cards, but we ask that if they wish to participate that they give a card to each member of their afternoon homeroom class. They may give cards to friends in the other two classes if they choose.

<u>Language Arts:</u> Students are continuing to improve their writing skills. Please continue to listen to your child read at home, to improve their fluency and comprehension.

<u>Math:</u> We will continue working on **adding two digit numbers.** Extra practice, at home, adding with dice or numbers on a deck of cards will develop your child's skill in this area. This is one of the most important (and sometimes tricky) topics in our math curriculum. Students will experience greater success with two-digit addition if they are efficient with addition facts to 18.

<u>Science</u>: We will continue learning about the properties of magnets and how magnets interact with other materials. Many of our experiments leave us wondering, "How is that possible?" Towards the end of February, students will bring home the outline for their final unit project where they will design a toy or game that uses magnets.

<u>Social:</u> Students have completed their study of the Acadian culture in Meteghan, Nova Scotia. Ask your child about some of the traditional Acadian foods we discussed. We also made and ate yummy 'snow pancakes' at the beginning of January We will continue our journey through Canada with our next unit, the **Prairie culture n Alberta and Saskatchewan**.
