

February will be another busy month in grade two. On <u>February 5th</u> grade twos will participate in their last <u>skating</u> class at the arena. Please meet at the arena at 1:15 pm if you are able to assist with the tieing of skates. Please send your child's skates and helmet (in a sturdy bag that is easy to carry) as well as mittens and snow pants. Students are not allowed on the ice without a <u>CSA</u> approved skating/hockey helmet. Bike helmets, skiing helmets, etc are not permitted.

We will enjoy a <u>JUMP ROPE FOR HEART</u> assembly on <u>Wednesday Feb. 5 at 9:00 am</u>. Students will learn about the importance of staying fit to keep their heart healthy. Students will participate in a variety of skipping activities during physical education class.

On Friday February 14 we will be inviting a *few students from each class to donate items for our Valentine's Day lunch.* A note will be sent home in February. A class list, with students first names, is located on the last page of the newsletter. Students are not required to exchange cards, but we ask that if they wish to participate that they give a card to each member of their homeroom class. They may give cards to friends in the other two classes if they choose.

Language Arts: Students are continuing to improve their writing skills. We are working on a variety of ways to become fluent writers and readers. Please check your child's Fresh Grade portfolio for updates. Please continue to listen to your child **read at home**, to improve their fluency and comprehension.

<u>Math</u>: We will continue working on **adding two digit numbers**. Extra practice, at home, adding with dice or numbers on a deck of cards will develop your child's skill in this area. **This is one of the most** *important (and sometimes tricky) topics in our math curriculum.* Students will experience greater success with two-digit addition if they are efficient with addition facts to 18.

<u>Science</u>: We will continue learning about the properties of **magnets** and how magnets interact with other materials. Many of our experiments leave us wondering, "How is that possible?" Towards the end of February, students will bring home the outline for their final unit project where they will design a toy or game that uses magnets.

<u>Social:</u> Students are enjoying their study of the **Acadian culture** in Meteghan, Nova Scotia. We are learning about the Acadian culture: language, food, clothing and festivals. Your child will enjoy playing the 'spoons' as part of our exciting learning activities. We will also create beautiful lighthouse paintings this month.
