Grade Two News- November 2018

In Language Arts:: Students continue to focus on reading and writing, incorporating spelling, word work and Daily 5 reading strategies into their daily practice. We have started using Raz-kids, a website that allows students to read interesting books at their level. Whether you prefer paper books or e-books, research tells us that in order for children to improve their reading, they need books at their level. This allows them to practice their strategies and not spend the entire time sounding out and decoding unknown words. Your child has learned a specific method and you can ask them how to pick a "good fit" book. We also ask that parents are reading at home 15-20 minutes a night. This is an essential part of your child's reading program as they need practice time each day. This should be a fun time with your child and not a fight. If they are fatigued, read to them, or use a reading site like Raz-kids, as listening to reading is also important for developing readers!

<u>In **Math**:</u> Students are continuing to explore the variety of ways to represent numbers (ten frames, place value, tally marks, expanded form). Extra practice on one of our 'helpful sites' for math, on our grade 2 webpage http://pesgrade2.weebly.com/ will enhance your child's numeracy skills. Practice counting coins will also help your child understand skip counting by 2s, 5s and 10s.

In Science: (Mrs. Abt) The students have enjoyed participating in many hands-on activities as we investigate the properties of water and other liquids. We are using some pretty impressive science vocabulary such as: viscosity, density, surface tension, and dissolving as we learn about how the behavior of molecules creates different types of matter. In November we will wrap up our liquids topic and move right into Buoyancy and Boats; this is another very popular unit because at the end, each student will design and build a mini boat and test it out. I will be asking students to bring some recycled materials for their boat building. More information will be sent home later in the month.

In **Social**: (Mrs. Wessner) Students are continuing to learn about Inuit culture and traditions. I hope your child was able to share their 'soapstone' carving of a polar bear. We will be learning about the natural resources and jobs in Iqaluit, Nunavut.

In **Physical Education**: (Mrs. Johansen) In October we have been practicing our throwing and catching skills with lots of games. We just started handling a ball with our feet for dribbling, trapping, passing and shooting. In November we will continue with more games that practice more ball handling skills such as dribbling, passing and shooting with our hands.

We will plan to go outside for gym every Wednesday, even on cold days! Please be sure that your child is dressed for the weather!

Computers

We are very impressed with how well most of the Grade Two kids have been working during computer time. Students are using the computer during a variety of classes (Math, Social, LA, Science). As a class we will be working on Digital Literacy and Citizenship (internet safety: never give out personal information to strangers, not talking mean to others, telling an adult if you feel scared, nervous, etc) but you may wish to discuss this at home too.
