Language:

We will continue working on building our stamina during **Daily 5 literacy** activities (read to self, read to someone, word work, work on writing and listen to reading). Students are enjoying working on their reading and writing stamina.

Home reading will begin this month. Please watch for the home reading bag (book and recording sheet). Students will be awarded a prize for every <u>25 nights of reading</u>. We ask that you please spend 10-15 min per night listening to your child read, to further enhance their accuracy and fluency skills. Thank you for your continued support.

<u>Math:</u>


We are continuing to work on **patterns**. Each child will be identifying, reproducing, extending and creating repeating and increasing patterns. We are also working on our **number sense** unit, students are learning to break apart teen numbers and find all the ways to make ten.

Science:

We will be continuing with our unit on **Exploring Liquids**. The kids are enjoying getting their hands wet while doing lots of experiments. There are lots of opportunities to identify and observe liquids at home; you can ask your child to compare different liquids and explain their properties. Coming up this month, we will also learn about the water cycle and the importance of water in our lives.

Social:

Students worked hard to remember the location of the 4 communities, from our first social unit. The four focus communities in grade two social studies are:: **Ponoka, AB/ Saskatoon, SK/ Meteghan, NS, and Iqaluit, NT.** We will begin our first exciting journey to Iqaluit, Nunavut. Please ask your child about Iqaluit and all the exciting learning adventures.
